Our **history** unit is 'The First World War and Nottingham'. We will learn about major events that




occurred during WW1, Nottingham's contribution to societal change, and the important role that women played during the war.

Maths



a classic story to share with children in Early Years. Our current class novel is Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo. The novel is about The First World War, which is our main topic, but there is much more to it than that. The novel covers universal themes such as childhood, school experiences, family bonds, loyalty, love and even death, in a sensitive way.

Our aim in art is to create a thoughtful propaganda poster inspired by the work of artists Luba Lukova & Shepard Fairey. Propaganda posters are useful in

persuading the audience into action and were often used during WW1. Our posters will combine materials and techniques to help deliver a message to the audience which we will think about very carefully before we make our final pieces.
