

Year 1 & 2 Information

English

To start the term, we will be reading 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. The children will be writing their own ending to the story. We will be learning about adverbs and will be using these in our writing. After this, they will complete a poetry unit looking at a book called 'Oi Frog! 'The children will also be doing lots of reading comprehension to further their understanding of their reading.





In spring 2, we

reading a book called 'Dear Greenpeace' and writing our own letters to Greenpeace about saving animals that are endangered. We will research some of the different animals that are being affected by climate change.

Maths

This term in maths we will be focusing on:

- Addition and subtraction using number lines
- Number facts e.g. number bonds, multiplication facts and other number patterns.
- Multiplication and division using pictorial representations, such as arrays.

PE

Did you know... a good nights sleep helps children's mental, physical, social and emotional development.

In PE this term the children will practicing different balances and naming things that they are good at. They will also learn coordination skills through activities using balls. PE kit is a school polo shirt, school jumper or cardigan, black jogging bottoms or leggings and trainers. No earrings to be worn.

Welcome back, we hope you had a fantastic Christmas and New Year. We have got some very exciting things to do this term.

Science

Our topics for this term are:

- 'materials'
- 'uses of everyday materials'

We will start by exploring a range of materials and identifying their properties

We will then develop our knowledge by working scientifically by doing lots of investigations to find out the properties of materials and their suitability for a variety of projects.



PSHE &

Relationships and Sex Education

In **PSHE** we will be learning about valuing differences and being the best version of ourselves.

In **RSE** we will be looking at the concept of male and female and gender stereotypes, to identify differences between males and females.

Geography

In the spring term, during our geography work, we will be consolidating our map skills and learning about the four points on a compass. We will use directional and locational language to describe where places are. We will look at comparing the human and physical geography of where we live, to some countries in Africa.



We will also be looking at the continent Antarctica. We will look at the animals that live in the Arctic circle and how their environment is changing.



Homework and Reading Books

You have received information about the REDTED reading incentive. Reading is essential to your child's learning journey and we urge you to read at least five times a week with your child and write in their reading diaries. It is important that your child brings their reading book every day as they will be reading on a daily basis.
